- 1. Call to order Barbara called the meeting to order at 6:06 pm.
- 2. Additions to agenda The Board agreed to go into executive session to discuss the candidates for the executive director position. The session concluded with a secret ballot.
- 3. Presentation by Angel Gonzalez regarding Coit Square Angel provided a number of new drawings showing a revision from 4plexes to twelve 2 unit, 2 story buildings with a mixture of traditional and (more expensive) modern architectural designs. This brings the number of units to 36 instead of the previously planned 39 (compared to the current 11 buildings); there will be 31 parking places build as part of the project and another 9 will be picked up on the street. In terms of materials, the project will use fiber cement, basic windows, no vinyl siding except facing the alley, and wood/brick/aluminum. Any of the buildings could be built as a single family home. There will be a series of townhomes on the other side of the block. Each unit will cost \$250,000+. Despite one individual's preference for traditional to modern architecture, Gretchen motioned and John seconded that the board support Angel's changes. The motion passed.
- Approval of minutes/financials It was noted that the Development committee needs a time frame stated; in addition, our assets need to be updated to reflect the new value of 700 Clancy. Gretchen motioned and Loren seconded approval of minutes/financials. The motion passed.
- 5. Committee Updates: GVSU Block 1 The board discussed GVSU's intention to build a parking ramp in the neighborhood. It was determined that the neighbors should have a chance to learn about and give input on multiple options at the open house on March 13, and committee members will advise GVSU accordingly.
- 6. New Business: Parking The board discussed DTN's intention to add cut out parking spaces at the Gateway. Angel proposed convening a mobility committee to look at parking, pedestrian and other transportation needs holistically in the neighborhood. Andy Guy provided additional information. Barbara will seek a meeting with Josh Naramore in the City's Mobility Department.
- 7. Old Business: In-Lieu of Tax Project Ideas Barbara learned from Eric DeLong at the City that the Coit Park bathroom will take more than a single year's PILOT money to renovate/rebuild. However, the park is in the City budget for FY2019 (summer 2018); she will begin exploring planning possibilities. Loretta and John will seek additional information from the Land Bank about the feasibility of gardening in the greenspace on Sinclair; assuming all goes well, they will follow up with neighbors to gauge interest.

- 9. Adjournment Barbara wrapped up the meeting by offering the executive director position to Elianna Bootzin, who accepted. The meeting was adjourned around 7:30 pm.
