## LEAD ABATEMENT WORKER

Lead abatement involves removing lead hazards in and outside of the home, and is an in high demand job in the Grand Rapids area. Here's how to get certified:

- 1. Pass a three day lead abatement worker training course
- 2. Apply for the state certification
- 3. Pass the state exam

# **GRCC JOB TRAINING PROGRAM**

GRCC's job training courses offers training in multiple different skilled trade programs to pursue state and national certifications. Programs include training for automotive technician, computer support technician, construction electrician, machinist/CNC technician, medical assistant, residential construction, and wielding/fabrication construction. These programs are provided with a tuition cost, but multiple different scholarships and grants are provided to help cover costs.
